

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

You may be able to participate if you:

- are at least 18 years of age
- have a primary diagnosis of schizophrenia
- have been on a stable dose of antipsychotic medication for at least 12 weeks before the study treatment period
- own a smartphone compatible with Android 10 or greater, or iOS 14 or greater

WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO CONSIDER ABOUT THIS STUDY?

- The study team will explain the possible benefits and risks.
- You do not have to participate if you do not want to.
- If you choose to participate, you can stop at any time.
- You will not be paid to participate. You may be reimbursed for reasonable travel costs or given a stipend for your time and cell phone charges.
- You will receive the study app and study-related tests and assessments at no cost.
- A team of doctors and nurses will monitor your health carefully.
- An Institutional Review Board (IRB) has approved this study. An IRB protects the rights, safety, and well-being of participants.

SCHIZOPHRENIA CLINICAL STUDY

WHAT IS A CLINICAL RESEARCH STUDY?

A clinical research study is a medical study that helps to answer important questions about an investigational medication, therapy or intervention. Questions such as:

- Does it work?
- How safe is it?
- Are there side effects?

Medications and therapies must be tested in clinical research studies before they can be given to patients. Without people taking part in these studies, we would have no new medications or therapies. People of all ages and backgrounds should take part in clinical research studies. Certain conditions and medications may affect people differently based on their age, sex, gender, and race/ethnicity.

ABOUT THE CONVOKE STUDY

This study is researching 2 different mobile apps to see if they are safe and effective in helping people who have certain symptoms of schizophrenia. If you choose to participate, you will use 1 of the mobile applications on your personal smartphone.

WHY IS THIS STUDY IMPORTANT?

People diagnosed with schizophrenia talk about their struggles with motivation and having a hard time enjoying things. These are common negative symptoms of schizophrenia. Standard treatment for schizophrenia involves a combination of medication and therapy.

This study will see if an app can be part of a schizophrenia treatment plan.

WHAT WILL THE STUDY INVOLVE?

If you participate, you will be in the Convoke Study for about 22 weeks. You will need to:

- Follow **all** instructions given by the study team
- Use the study app every day for 16 weeks.
- Attend all your study center visits and telephone calls. These are important for your health and safety.



22 weeks
Once daily
for 16 weeks

The study has 3 parts



Screening period (up to 2 weeks)

- If you agree to take part, you will visit the study center to see if the study is suitable for you.



Study treatment period (about 16 weeks)

- You will visit the study center 3 times for study assessments.
- You will have 2 telephone calls.
- You will use the study app daily at the same time every day.



Follow-up period (about 4 weeks)

- You will have 1 telephone call with the study team.
- You will no longer use the study app every day.
