# **FILM SYNOPSIS:**

Through intimate stories of patients, families, and medical providers, BEDLAM is a feature-length documentary that immerses us in the national crisis surrounding care of the severely mentally ill. Filmed over five years, it brings us inside one of America's busiest psychiatric emergency rooms, into jails where psychiatric patients are warehoused, and to the homes – and homeless encampments – of mentally ill members of our communities, where silence and shame often compound personal suffering. The story is told in part by director Kenneth Paul Rosenberg, MD, whose own life journey has been profoundly impacted by a severely mentally ill family member.

### **BOOK SYNOPSIS:**

Dr. Rosenberg gives readers an inside look at the historical, political, and economic forces that have resulted in the greatest social crisis of the twenty-first century. The culmination of a seven-year inquiry, BEDLAM is not only a rallying cry for change, but also a guidebook for how we move forward with care and compassion, with resources that have never before been compiled, including legal advice, practical solutions for parents and loved ones, help finding community support, and information on therapeutic options.

# **SOCIAL IMPACT GOALS:**

We see an opportunity to use BEDLAM to shift the understanding of the crisis in care for the severely mentally ill in the US and facilitate urgently needed change. We will leverage distribution of the film and book towards the following calls to action:

- 1. Destigmatize and decriminalize serious mental illness
- 2. Advocate for better treatments on par with other fields of medicine
- 3. Address the housing crisis for people with serious mental illnesses

We will curate a tool kit and events to support the film and book. Impact will be targeted to the following areas: policy, community, and institutions.

1. **Policy:** BEDLAM is a perfect tool to educate and engage lawmakers at the federal, state, and local level to address the urgent gaps in mental healthcare. Bedlam can be an impetus for them to adopt supportive policy measures.

We have identified the following as crucial locations for engagement:

- Iowa and New Hampshire discuss mental health with primary candidates
- California screen film with the Governor and other state officials
- Washington DC Capitol Hill screening with pertinent committees
- Texas inroads to Judicial Commission for Mental Health
- 2. **Community:** We recognize the importance of showing audiences not just what is broken, but what is working to provide viewers and readers with calls to action for how to effect change in their own communities.

Successful models for advocacy include:

- The Trieste model and its proposed applications in Los Angeles
- Grassroots successes in Ohio using the sequential intercept model
- Therapeutic courts: Judge Liefman (FL), Dr. Kazan (TX), Judge Dohi (CA), and the Center for Court Innovation
- 3. **Institutions:** There are many institutional avenues to share BEDLAM and our messaging to improve systems. With the help of our partners, we will target universities, professional education programs, and law enforcement organizations for outreach. We will also pursue collaborations with member based organizations such as our partner NAMI (The National Alliance on Mental Illness).
